

Activities for observing movement in other contexts

The following activities are designed to promote self-directed play. These are just examples of suitable activities.

Playdough

In addition to the usual cutters and rolling pins which demonstrate movement, a number of tools provide excellent opportunities for observing different movements, including:

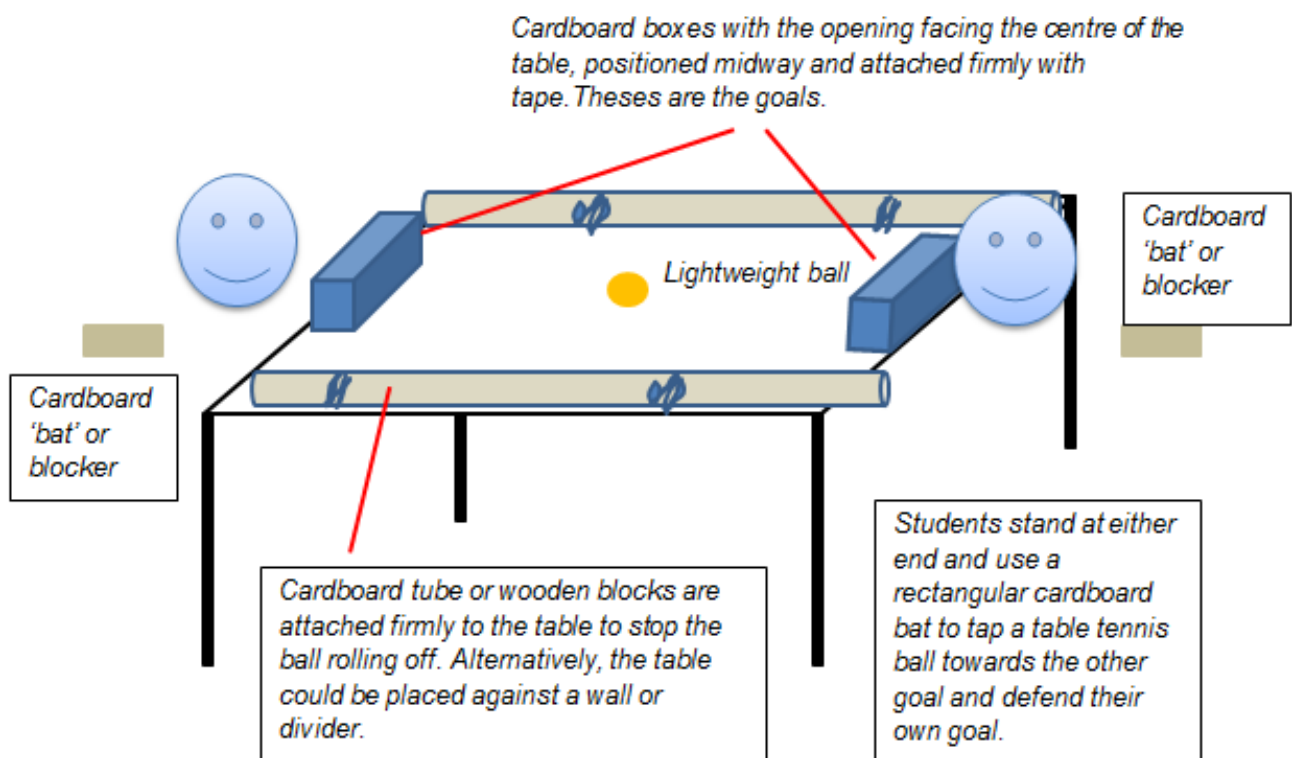
marbles	pastry flutes/rollers	string
toy cars	scissors	bucket scales

Construction game

Commercially-available construction sets, including train sets, provide many opportunities to build and observe objects moving in different ways.

Table soccer

A rectangular table can be made into a table soccer game with just a few cardboard boxes and some tape, as follows:



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
